Annemarie's Crochet Poppy

You will need:

DK Wool in Red, Black (Purple)

3.5mm - 4mm crochet hook (depending on how you want your poppy to look)

Pattern:

Using #red wool make a floop/magic ring or 4ch and join into ring with ss

1st round - 8dc into loop join with ss to first dc

2nd round - 1ch, 2dc into each st, ss to 1st st (makes 16 stitches) #

3rd round - *3ch, 1dtr into 1st st at base of chain, 2trtr into next st, 2trtr into next st, 1dtr into next st, 3ch ss into previous dtr base st. Ss into next st and repeat from * another 3 times

Fasten off

Notes:

You can use black wool as the centre ring using the pattern from # to # then change to red or purple wool from *. Or you can felt a black centre over the top of the central ring or sew a button in.

Don't worry if your count isn't right between petals as you can always ss one and it will still look right.

If you hook over your tail during the first ring you can tighten the centre and it means less sewing up.

Leaving a tail at the beginning and/or the end means you can tie your poppy to just about anything.

Have fun!

dc - double crochet

dtr - double treble crochet

trtr - triple treble crochet

ss - slip stitch

Annemarie's Crochet Poppy for Hanging on a Black Background

You will need:

DK Wool in Red, Black (Purple)

3.5mm - 4mm crochet hook (depending on how you want your poppy to look)

Pattern:

Using #red wool make a floop/magic ring or 8ch and join into ring with ss

1st round - 16dc into loop join with ss to first dc #

2nd round - *3ch, 1dtr into 1st st at base of chain, 2trtr into next st, 2trtr into next st, 1dtr into next st, 3ch
ss into previous dtr base st. Ss into next st and repeat from * another 3 times

Fasten off

Notes:

This leaves a large circle in the middle which will show through when you sew it on to a black background.

Don't worry if your count isn't right between petals as you can always ss one and it will still look right.

If you hook over your tail during the first ring you can tighten the centre and it means less sewing up.

Leaving a tail at the beginning and/or the end means you can tie your poppy to just about anything.

Sarah's Crochet Poppy

You will need:

DK Wool in Red, Black and Green
3.5mm crochet hook

Pattern:

Using red wool 5ch join into ring

1st round - 3ch, 9tr into ring, ss into top ch to join

2nd round - 3ch, 1tr into first st, 2tr into each st to last st, ss in to top chain to join

3rd round - 3ch, 2tr into first st, 3tr into each st to last st, ss in to top chain to join

4th round - 3ch, 1tr into first st, 2tr into each st to last st, ss in to top chain to join

Fasten off

Centre of Poppy:

Using green wool 5ch join into ring

3ch, 9tr in to ring, ss in to top chain to join

Fasten off - sew in ends

Using black wool Join yarn to edge of green circle 1ch

1dc into first st, 1ch repeat to end of round

Ss to join

Fasten off leaving a long tail to attach invisibly to body of poppy

dc - double crochet

tr - treble crochet

ss - slip stitch

Beryl's Crochet Poppy Pattern

Using red DK wool Size 3 hook

5 ch Slip stitch into a ring

1 ch 6 DC into ring sl into 1 ch

1 ch 2 DC into each DC

sl into 1 ch (12 DC)

1 ch 2 DC into each DC (24DC) sl into 1 ch

2 ch 2 tr into 1 DC 1 tr into next DC 2 tr into next DC 1 tr into next DC 2 tr into next DC

2 ch sl into next DC

Repeat x3 sl to finish

Use a black button for centre

Abbreviations:

ch - chain

DC - double crochet

sl - slip stitch

tr - treble

Feel free to adapt it and make it your own - why not try using glittery wool or two different sorts of thin red together, or even a very ornate button - the world is your oyster!
